After Henry’s passing, Marie moved to be with her family and I saw less of her. Nevertheless, I always received such wondrous gifts from Marie, usually in the form of second hand clothing from her nieces on her side of the family. I thank them for those clothes, as they became my play-clothes for the summer, and often, school clothes that a family of six struggled to find the means to purchase. On one visit there was a table and chairs suitable for tea parties. I was over the moon to receive such a bounty.

In addition to being my aunt, Marie was my godmother. I wrote to her as an older child and a teen, in hopes of having more frequent contact, but as she told me during one visit; she loved my letters, but didn’t write letters herself. At that time, long distance phone calls were pricey. So, between distance, cost of phone calls, and life in general, we did not correspond, and I regret I did not reach out to remedy this during her lifetime.

I’ve always believed that Uncle Henry was Marie’s soulmate and one true love, and in whatever afterlife there may be, I hope they have been rejoined. I will miss you, Aunt Marie, more than I ever thought.
